

Report on Monsoon Theme Presentation 2023

We have always tried to bond with nature in Santa Maria's lush surroundings. Our children get to experience nature and its abundance with the change in season. The summer monsoon is known for its heavy rainfall. It usually occurs between the months of April and September.

Monsoon! Kgs ' first special assembly was held on July 28th, 2023. Children were thrilled to perform and say their dialogues. KG C's Monsoon theme presentation was primarily divided into the following eight segments:-



- *Arrival of monsoon season.
- *Where does rain come from?
- *Why do we need rain?
- *Fun in rain - muddy puddles.

*Rainwater harvesting.

*Insects that love being around in the rainy season.

*Monsoon essentials (cleanliness and hygiene)

*Animals in the rainy season.

Prior to the presentation children were made aware of the water cycle by 'Carl cloud'. This helped them to connect to the presentation even better.

The show started with an introduction by weather man, predicted the arrival of the monsoon season with heavy rainfall.



Children playing outside are disturbed due to rain. They start questioning each other why does it rain?

They decide to ask the weatherman he explains it is due to the '**water cycle**'.

The presentation of the water cycle is shown by the **Sun, cloud and raindrops**.

Our two clouds clearly illustrated how small clouds merged to become large and heavy, before pouring down. Children dramatized the process of the water cycle and ended it by saying- The water cycle goes round and round all over the earth.

Children entered with their **rain gear** (raincoat and umbrella). Nothing could stop them from enjoying the rain. Who hasn't heard of "**Peppa Pig's muddy puddle song**"? Both of them began to bounce on the muddy puddle, and the audience could

connect with them instantaneously.



As we know the rivers wait for rain. The **Crop** was also waiting for the rainfall from a long time and finally got happy after heavy rainfall.

Now the question was what to do with all the rainwater. This is where "rainwater harvesting comes into the picture.

A child gave a wonderful explanation of how rainwater be saved and used later. "He said I've gathered some rainwater inside my bucket. It will be used for cleaning my home, watering plants, washing my bicycle and so much more."



The teacher informed the students that even **Santa Maria** has a **rainwater harvesting pit** that they must visit.

Next children came with delicious food items like **pakoda**, **corn** and **hot chocolate** that we can enjoy during the monsoon season.



The '**Bacteria**' reminded us to be cautious during the season. The risk of being exposed to infections is two times higher during the monsoon than in any other season. Food items should be consumed immediately, we should wash our hands regularly.



Then "**MOSQUITO**" Louie arrived. When he danced and moved around, the kids couldn't stop laughing. But when He said he is waiting to spread **dengue and malaria**. The children said they should maintain a clean environment and not let water get collected since mosquitoes breed in stagnated water.



The last segment of the show was about animals in the monsoon season. When **Snail, Peacock, and Frog** entered, they all enjoyed the rain because it kept them cool.

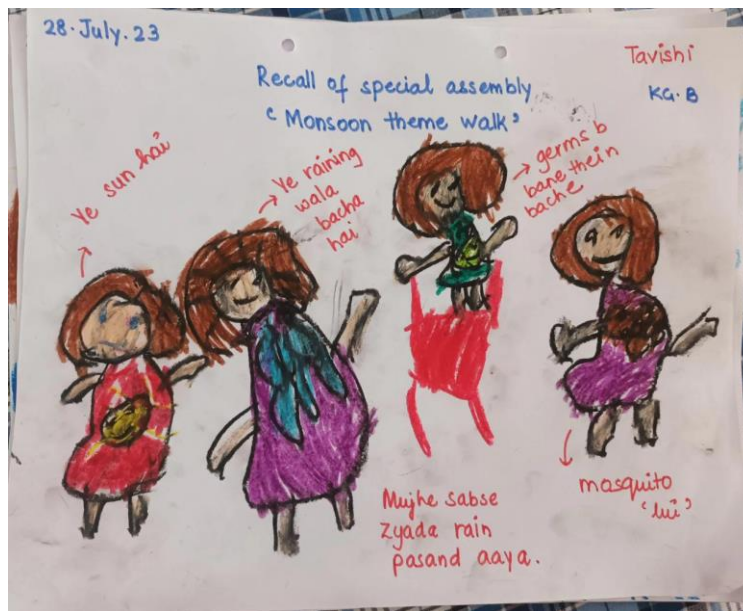




The presentation concluded with the children singing the song **"I Feel The Rain....."** which was thoroughly enjoyed by all.
