On the 27<sup>th</sup> of April 2023, during the cool and early hours of the day, KG's went for their first outdoor visit, 'A walk in the vicinity'.






A 'Circle Time' was a regular practice to help children understand the objective of the visit and good practices to be observed during it.

As soon as children saw water in the pool, they could immediately relate it to the Earth Day presentation on saving water.






We moved into the field to observe the vegetable garden with fresh spinach and many trees bearing fruits like guava, chikoo, mango, and lemon.

Dhanvit said, "Ma'am mere gaon mein bhi aisa khet hai."


Kiyan said, "Mei Garmi mei khub nimboo pani pita hoon."
