They enjoyed the cooking without fire activity where they made a tricolor with fruits like oranges, papaya, grapes, kiwis and bananas.




They did the sequencing of the tricolor while making the fruit salad.




Children also discussed with each other and designed a flag for their class to understand diversity and how to represent it on a flag.
